PHIL BROWN RETURNS

Phil Brown joined us as manager in March 2013, replacing Paul Sturrock, and leading Southend United out at Wembley for the first time, as we reached the final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final, which we lost 2-0 to Crewe.

Phil had a successful first full season, with the **Blues** reaching the L2 Play Off semi finals, losing to Burton Albion in May 2014. Of course, the following season was truly memorable, with **Blues** going all the way to the Play Off final against Wycombe Wanderers at Wembley, and a fantastic 122nd minute equalising goal from Joe Piggott to take us to a nail biting penalty shoot out.

Dan Bentley, in goal was the penalty hero, saving the penalty which gave us a 7-6 win and unbelievable scenes both on the pitch and in the stand.

Two seasons later was another good one with Blues looking as if they were going to reach the Play Offs again, but we missed out on the final day by one point to Millwall.

In January 2018, Phil was relieved of his duties with **Blues** in trouble at the wrong end of the L1 table and succeeded by **Blues** legend, Chris Powell.

Phil was re-appointed by Chairman Ron Martin with six games remaining in L2, and despite 9 points from those six games, it wasn't enough to save us.

Phil's seen 100 wins as Southend manager and we all hope he's going to see many, many more! We know Phil has always been a big supporter of **Junior Blues** events so we look forward to seeing him soon.
