Getting to 200 members is now firmly in our sights, having reached the 174 mark with born and bred Shrimper Paul Clark coming on board. Paul joins Alan Little, Chris Powell and Steve Tilson in being in that select SUEPA member group of having both played and managed the club.

Our signings over the last three months have really spanned the decades, right from Alan Dicks who came to Roots Hall over 60 years ago in 1958 right through to those still playing - Anthony Wordsworth, Joe Piggot (both AFC Wimbledon) and Carl Pettefer (Wimborne Town). Midfielders and strikers have been the dominant theme for our recent joiners, with Nicky Smith, Adam Locke, Phil Gridelet, Chris Guthrie (more on him later), Peter Abbot, Martin Carruthers, and our very own Great Dane John Nielsen joining the SUEPA clan. Mel Capleton also became our 19th keeper.

As ever our SUEPA Agents have tracked down Shrimpers in a variety of ways. It was known that Chris Guthrie had once played for Newcastle United and that they had their own former players association, so we made contact with St James Park and a few phone calls later by those kind folk in Geordie-land we were speaking to Chris direct. Nicky Smith meanwhile was simply spotted at Roots Hall at a recent game taking in a game as part of his 50th birthday celebrations - no one is safe! We always appreciate some help though – if you are still in touch with one of your former Roots Hall team mates who is not currently a SUEPA member then do please do let us know.

## SUEPA MEMBERS BACK AT ROOTS HALL

For the home game v Accrington Stanley on 15 December we re-united former strike partners James Walker and Lee Barnard. Their time as fellow Shrimpers is closely linked, James scoring on his Southend debut in 2008 in a match in which Lee also scored. As always when former players come to visit, old friends were re-united, memories were relived and new memories were created. Theo Robinson even halted his run-out to the pitch to greet James and Lee!



Then on 2 February for the match v Bristol Rovers we had something a little bit different. Drewe Broughton returned to Roots Hall and first spent time in the club shop, meeting fans and selling copies of his recently published book, 'And Then What ..?'



Usually there is a pre-match meal in the Legends Lounge, but on this occasion we smuggled in some fish and chips to fuel him up before the usual on-the-pitch introduction before kick-off. It was a great day, Drewe sold out his book supply but, more than that, met so many fans who we suspect without exception relived with him his goal that took us to our first ever national final at the Millennium Stadium in 2004.

One thing Drewe was also more than happy to do was to help with some publicity for the Carli Lansley Foundation, a fund set up by Blues fan Karl after tragically losing his wife to Sudden Arrythmic Death Syndrome (SADS) in 2017. Karl and his two young children are season ticket holders at Roots Hall and their fund supports the charity CRY (Cardiac Risk in the Young) with the focus on paying for screening programmes in the Southend area. In his busy life Karl still finds time to sit on the Shrimpers Trust Board, and SUEPA is proud to help him in any way we can raise the profile of his fund raising in memory of Carli. SUEPA President Adam Barrett is a patron of the Carli Lansley Foundation.

After leaving Southend I went to Sheffield United. My first game was in Gibraltar and we stayed at the Gibraltar Rock Hotel. One of the players came into my room and said to look out of the window and there was my entire footwear, shoes, football boots, trainers etc floating in the sea. Everyone thought it was funny at the time .... except me!

5. What did you do after hanging up your playing boots and do you ever get back to Roots Hall to see a game?

Worked as a coach at Newcastle United and also did some modelling. Although I haven't been back to Roots Hall, I always look for the results and any news about the club.

#### The following will be taking place:

- Saturday 2 March v Barnsley: ever one to spot an opportunity, we found out that Derrick Parker will be at Roots Hall as a co-commentator for Radio Sheffield for this match between the two teams he notched up over 100 appearances each for in the 1970's/80's. So, we've arranged for Derrick to escape from the commentary box pre and post-match for a few 'hello's' and, as the Roots Hall commentary box is not the most palatial, perhaps a welcome stretch of the legs!
- Saturday 16 March v AFC Wimbledon: Peter Daley will be our guest for this match.
