Shrimpers Trust Youth Team Round Up

Southend United's Under-18 team will be looking to continue their excellent run from the end of last season when they get their Football League Youth Alliance campaign underway in August.

The Shrimpers youth team, who will again appear with 'Shrimpers Trust' emblazoned on their shirts for the 2008/9 season, ended last year on a seven-match unbeaten run to conclude their campaign in eighth place amongst the 13 teams.

The spell began with a 3-2 home win over eventual runners-up Gillingham, with trialist Harry Crawford adding to first-half efforts from Jack Morris and Stuart O'Keefe. Michael Moon, another player brought in to trial with the club, scored the Blues' goal in a 1-1 draw at Rushden & Diamonds, and he was on target again when Barnet were dismissed 3-0 at Boots & Laces. This time he tapped in the final goal in an accomplished display, his effort following strikes from Jamie Forshaw and O'Keefe.

Peterborough United had proved to be difficult opponents throughout the season, and only a clinical James Lindie strike eleven minutes before half-time earned a 1-1 draw against the Posh. United then delayed Queens Park Rangers' title-winning party as second-half goals from David Obaze and Lindie – in the first minute of stoppage time – earned a 2-1 victory.

An incredible 5-1 victory over Colchester United was a magnificent way in which to sign off at Boots & Laces. Forshaw opened the scoring just three minutes in before Lindie soon added a second. Rhys Henry was brought down in the penalty area, and after his initial effort was saved from the spot, the then second-year swept home the rebound. O'Keefe set up Lindie and Tashan Adeyinka either side of a consolation strike for the U's.

Another fine display saw Brentford defeated 2-1 in the last match of the term with O'Keefe on target again and Ronnie Jones adding a late winner inside the final ten minutes. Blues Youths showed a lot of determination to prove any dolubters wrong and improve their League standing, and with a new intake of first-year scholars entering the fray for 2008/9, the new season promises to be an exciting time for Ricky Duncan's Centre of Excellence.

As they seek to prepare themselves for the new term, Southend United's youngsters are currently undertaking a tour of Denmark, where they will face Aalborg and Randers. When they return, you can watch them as they tackle:
