Quid-a-Goal

Our Quid a Goal scheme is now up and running for the 2014/15 Season.

The aim of the scheme - like most of the Shrimpers Trust's activities is to raise money for Southend United Football Club and make sure that there is a club for us to be supporting in the foreseeable future.

In particular, some of the money raised from this Seasons "Quid a Goal" scheme will again be donated to the Southend United Physio Ben Clarkson and his Department to help purchase much needed equipment.

This is how it works:

Those who support the scheme with a pledge have their name and details of their pledge displayed in the United match program each week and are detailed on this web site.

We ask you to pledge ± 0.25 , ± 0.50 , ± 1.00 or more under various headings such as clean sheets, various players scoring goals, or team goals. This does not have to cost you a fortune as you can easily judge in advance how much your pledge will cost you come the end of the season.

For example, the Blues rarely manage more than 80 goals in a season from 1st team matches. A £0.25 per goal pledge would therefore most likely not cost you more than £20.00 come the end of the season. If funds are tight how about £1 for every goal scored by our full backs? If you chose to do £0.50 per point and we finished up with 72 points as we did last season this would cost you £36.00.

At the end of the season we will write to you thanking you for your support of this initiative and asking you to send us a cheque for the amount owed.

Last year this scheme raised around \pounds 1,850 from the 68 people that helped us. This includes support by some of the Southend United's directors.

JUNIOR BLUES – A LINK TO ERNIE SHEPHERD

We were delighted to welcome our then youngest Junior Blue member, 7 month old Hayden Roche, at the recent Meet the Blues Day at Boots and Laces.

Little did we realise the significance of Hayden's joining until our Junior Blues received their latest newsletter.

Hayden's mum contacted us, and it turns out that Hayden is the youngest great grandson of former Southend United manager, Ernie Shepherd.

For those of you with memories not long enough to remember, Ernie was manager from 1st April 1967 until 1st October 1969. Ernie was responsible for some very significant buys for Blues at that time, notably a very nominal fee of £100 for his final signing for Southend United, future England player and manager, Peter Taylor, from Canvey Island; a club record fee at that time, of £17,000, to Liverpool for Phil Chisnall, and probably the most astute piece of business from Southend's point of view, £3,000 to Northampton Town to secure the diminutive – and now legendary

Despite being a Yorkshire man, born and bred, Ernie settled in Leigh on Sea. He and his wife, Sylvia, had a daughter, who then went on to have two daughters herself. Hayden's mum is one of those daughters, Tara. Her sister, Keeley, has two sons and was also in attendance at Meet the Blues Day. Her oldest son, 15 year old Elliott is part of the SUFC Development Squad and can be seen 3rd from the left in the back row.





Her younger son, 6 year old Ethan, is also very much at home being part of SUFC, both boys are season ticket holders, and Ethan is seen here with current manager, Phil Brown, at Meet the Blues Day.
