JOURNEY TO THE GILLS

On Saturday 5th October nine Shrimpers Trust members together with Southend United's Head of Commercial Rhys Ellingham will be putting on their walking boots to trek the 33.4 miles to the away game between Southend United and Gillingham FC to raise funds for the Trust and Little Havens Hospice.

The team will be setting off from Roots Hall at the ridiculous hour of 11pm the previous day, aiming to arrive at the PriestField Stadium in time for a 3pm kick off the following day.

"Journey to the Gills" was formally launched on Saturday 31st August at half time during Southend United's home game with Rochdale. The walkers/support team of Deborah Davidson, Rhys Ellingham, Paul FitzGerald, Tom Flynn, Sarah Franklin, Lesley Hicks, Sean Lopeman, Callum Reavell, Callum Turp, Bryan Woodford and Paul Yeomanson, were joined pitch side at Roots Hall by Little Havens community fundraiser Sally Bridger and her colleagues from Little Havens.



Also joining the group for the launch was Mike Paterson from our headline sponsors MSPFX Foreign Currency Services.

Quid-a-Goal

Our Quid a Goal scheme is now up and running for the 2019/20 Season.



The current total after 9 games is £155.25

The aim of the scheme - like most of the Shrimpers Trust's activities is to raise money for Southend United Football Club and make sure that there is a club for us to be supporting in the foreseeable future.

For the season 2019/20, some of the money raised from this 'Quid a Goal' scheme will be donated to Ricky Duncan's Youth department to help ensure that players of the quality of Daniel Bentley, Ted Smith, Jack Payne, Dru Yearwood, Elvis Bowomo and Charlie Kelman continue to be nurtured and made available to the first team.

This is how it works:

Those who support the scheme with a pledge have their name displayed in the United match program each week and are detailed on this web site.

We ask you to pledge ± 0.25 , ± 0.50 , ± 1.00 or more under various headings such as clean sheets, various players scoring goals, or team goals. This does not have to cost you a fortune as you can easily judge in advance how much your pledge will cost you come the end of the season.

For example, the Blues rarely manage more than 70 goals in a season from 1st team matches (18/19 League goals - 55). A £0.25 per goal pledge would therefore most likely not cost you more than £20.00 come the end of the season. If you chose to do £0.50 per point and we finished up with 80 points, at the end of the season we will write to you thanking you for your support of this initiative asking you to send us a cheque for the amount of £40.00.

Last year this scheme raised just over \pounds 2,000 from the 60+ people that helped us. This includes support by some of the Southend United's directors.
