

## THE INTRODUCTION – Paul FitzGerald

# Goodness me, it's only a few weeks since the last new newsletter and much of what we wanted to happen, has not, and plenty that we did not want, has!

Sadly, the optimism and enthusiasm of our new manager and his entourage, have not turned our fortunes on the pitch around, in fact, as I write this the opposite is true (post Bolton).

There is some sympathy for Mark, as the fortunes off the pitch, never quite seem to get to what was probably the expected starting line when he joined us. Certainly, there is no shortage of effort and, in fact, performances are much improved, but at the end of the day, the League Table does not lie.

Whilst the football club chairman once again found the money to pay what we owed previously to HMRC, thus preventing the HMRC from winding us up, he has, so far, not found the money to pay them what we owe now.....

SUFC are not alone of course, and there are some suggestions that upwards of 20 clubs are in a precarious position, waiting on the deliberations of the Government, the EFL and, of course, the Premier League, which the government believe, should bail the lower clubs out.

The "Ron out" brigade shout ever louder, as results go against us, with the bulk of those shouting loudest, citing years of mis management.

There is not really a "Ron in" brigade currently. However, it is worth remembering, that, the last time I checked, there was not a queue at the gates, of people willing to step in and pump money into an overspending, underperforming football club.

The only asset that the club has (and this goes back to before Ron Martin's ownership) is the franchise that allows a football club to exist in the borough. The football club is entirely dependent on its owner and the long awaiting development. Even if Ron were to sell up, he wouldn't be selling the property element...so, like it or not, we are stuck with what we have, for a little longer.

I say "a little longer" because at the time of writing we are expecting a 2nd significant announcement regarding the Stadium (the first arriving on 19th Nov). Of course, we've been here before, several times, so until it turns up, the doubts will remain! However, it has to be said, the signs from the council are positive and the full council meeting on the 10th is perhaps one of the most important meetings EVER for our football club.

### Ron Martin Q & A

The unrest that many feel (in particular with the embargo and the results) led to the Trust organising a face to face Q & A (socially distanced of course) at Roots Hall. Representatives from all formal supporters' groups were invited by the Trust and 30 or so attended. Interpreted minutes have been widely reported by others, so I won't repeat everything that happened, but I list a few points that may be of interest, that have not been completely reported elsewhere, that I have seen.



The purpose of this meeting was 3-fold...to get answers, to show the depth of feeling and finally, to improve communication going forward.

Chris Phillips was refused an invite (by Ron), despite my protestations. Imagine my frustration then, on the night, as Ron asked whether he was in attendance.

Yes, we owe HRMC more money and it's down to the clubs to agree a payment plan – but there is no danger of another winding up order for a while.

Ron, stated he couldn't be expected to remember everything, after being asked why the promise (by end of September) to repay away ticket money owed to fans for the last 2 away games of last season had not been paid. (The following morning it was paid)

Much discussion about embargo/players etc. etc. and then the commitment to clear embargo for the January window – a question "Won't that be too late?" – then much more discussion about the team.

"All wages up to date" - "No chance of points deduction."

"4 more players coming soon – plenty expected to leave, even some who joined recently".

The meeting signed off with the commitment that further sessions would be held in the coming weeks.

Key expectations from the meeting were:

- Good news from the council VERY soon
- A phone call to clear the embargo
- Some signings
- Fans patience

So...what has changed since that night?

Some news appeared on the club website, and in the press, and the **council** have held their meeting. However, despite an apparent overwhelmingly positive view, we now wait for the full Council meeting (mid December).

The **embargo** has not been cleared.

Signings would be pointless - we can't even play the players we have signed.

Patience has worn thin due to the unfulfilled expectations

Ron Martin really is his own worse enemy. With 30 vociferous fans in front of him, he suggests a simple phone call, is all that is needed to rid us of this embargo mess. Four weeks on from that, it's clear that the phone call turned out to be anything but simple. In fact the rules have changed several times since his intentions were made public, but his inability to clarify or communicate with the fans, means that most, just think he lied in the first place.

Ron's note to me, yesterday says "it was a phone call to HMRC to enter into a Time to Pay (TtP) agreement. We no longer need this to lift embargo and expect, temporary embargo to be lifted this week" ..... it has taken four weeks to get to a point, where an explanation is forthcoming? I'm sure there are very good reasons (financial) that have changed his strategy, but where does that leave his credibility with the fans?

On a zoom call today (29th Nov) with Ron, I put these points to him and he acknowledged the need to communicate more and has promised to make public the reasons behind the delay within the next day or so.

### CHRISTMAS APPEAL – OFF THE STREETS

Some of our regular readers/members will remember that for the last couple of years around this time we have collected food for charities that work with the homeless, last year it was Harp and very grateful they were too. This year we have chosen "Off The Streets", we have had a relationship with them for a little while and some of their guests were recipients of our hospitality, via our Community scheme, part funded by Aviva. This year, of course, we are unable to do a food collection or at least not in the same way, so we have decided to support their current scheme (see details below), Southend Supporters have been very generous in the past and I hope they will consider this a worthwhile cause, at this, especially tricky time for the homeless. We have decided, that as we have been unable to reasonably run the POTM award so far this season, that we will donate the missing months from last season, together with this season's so far, as a Trust donation. We hope to encourage other fans' groups to join us, so that we can make a real difference.

If you could spare the cost of a Match Day Ticket or Pie/Pint the money collected will go a long way towards making a life (or 2) easier – please donate what you can.

# HELP US TO HELP OTHERS END 2020 WITH A SMILE ON THEIR FACE AND HOPE IN THEIR HEARTS.

2020 has been a tough year for so many of us in many different ways and for a lot of us we will look back on 2020 with sadness, regret, thinking about lost opportunities and how we haven't been able to achieve all we hoped. Sadly, one thing hasn't changed and that is the number of rough sleepers on our streets.

We are approaching the coldest months and unlike previous years, we will not have any churches opening their doors to some of the most vulnerable in our society. (They are running a befriending service though if you want to volunteer).

We wanted to change that at Off the Streets and we want to end 2020 changing someone's life. Hence, we have paid for 6 rooms for the months of December and January and we will put rough sleepers into them. Whilst in them, we will work intensely with them to help find permanent accommodation and then continue that help once they are housed as we always do. Once they have moved into permanent accommodation we will place another rough sleeper into the hotel and so on and so on.

This is your chance to help - would you like to sponsor a room for 1 night or for a week or even a month, you will literally change someone's life.

Any donation will help us to help people get off the streets this winter but ...

1 night costs roughly £40-£50 per person

1 week costs roughly £280 -£350 per person

1 month costs roughly £1200

We will not be sending anyone to the street at the end of January but anyone who is still in the rooms will move directly to our new shelter we hope to have opened then and we will carry on supporting them

For the season 2020/21, some of the money raised from this 'Quid a Goal' scheme will be donated to Ricky Duncan's Youth department to help ensure that players of the quality of Daniel Bentley, Ted Smith, Jack Payne, Dru Yearwood, Elvis Bwomono and Charlie Kelman continue to be nurtured and made available to the first team.

### This is how it works:

Those who support the scheme with a pledge have their name displayed in the United match program.

We ask you to pledge  $\pm 0.25$ ,  $\pm 0.50$ ,  $\pm 1.00$  or more under various headings such as clean sheets, various players scoring goals, or team goals. This does not have to cost you a fortune as you can easily judge in advance how much your pledge will cost you come the end of the season.

For example, the Blues rarely manage more than 70 goals in a season from 1st team matches. A £0.25 per goal pledge would therefore most likely not cost you more than £20.00 come the end of the season. If you chose to do £0.50 per point and we finished up with 80 points, at the end of the season we will write to you thanking you for your support of this initiative asking you to send us a cheque for the amount of £40.00.
