

THE INTRODUCTION – Paul FitzGerald

So much has happened to our football club since our last newsletter, I hardly know where to begin.

A month or so, is a long time in football and that is no more apparent than at Southend, where a dramatic turnaround from probably our lowest ebb on and off the pitch, now gives fresh optimism to the Southend faithful.

The effort, enthusiasm and commitment on the pitch recently, has warmed the cockles as they may say locally, long may it continue!

The current situation on and off the pitch was one of many items discussed at the last Trust **Liaison meeting** with the football club. (Minutes available on-line)

The various communication channels that the Club has with its fans, was a key topic. The recent forum, hosted by Stan Collymore, being a welcome addition, but not a replacement, for neither the Trust Liaison, nor the Supporter group, meetings. All felt that the supporter group meetings should continue, but perhaps in a hybrid form to allow both physical and on-line attendance. Streaming also to be considered.

We also discussed our Player of the month awards which were curtailed several months back for obvious reasons, all present agreed that these would be resurrected, with the Trust once again making a donation to the charity of the winning players choice.

Further discussion at the Liaison covered our Social Inclusion scheme which appears to fit in very well with the work April Smith is doing at SUCET/SUFC.

An agreement to work closer together to utilise the Trust's Social Inclusion budget was felt the best way forward.

Recent contact with "Children in Care" and the signing of a certain "International" gave us further food for thought.

Liaison meetings are held approximately every 6 weeks and include a variety of topics, if you would like us to raise anything on your behalf, please feel free to send questions/issues to me.

The Chairman of the football club does not attend the Liaison meetings. As many of you know he has been absent recently for games. His appearance on the Zoom calls sparked very mixed emotions, particularly as the decline of the club both on and off the pitch appeared never ending and the calls themselves have ceased. The club were in a tricky position because, their attempt at transparency (2021's most over used word) coincided with a large number of fans not wanting to listen nor believe anything said and many wanting his immediate exit. A sad, but in many ways understandable situation. Ron Martin, of course still owns and funds the club (although not always in a timely fashion), however, his absence physically and the turnaround sparked by the recruitment of Tom Lawrence, Stan Collymore, John Still and Kevin Maher (with his team) seems to have appeased the protesters for now. It is obvious, however, that the situation is still somewhat fragile, as funds are still very tight at the club. It's amazing what three points on a reasonably regular basis does....

Rumours circulate that Ron is ill, he assures me he is not and in fact states "I am in very good health". He is also encouraged about progress being made on the new Stadium project, which

coincides with comments from Tom Lawrence regarding detailed planning during our liaison meeting.

An "interesting" situation developed for the Trust just before the embargo was cleared. Whilst the club were trying hard to agree a "time to pay", the hold-up was that the pattern of payments did not match HMRC's requirements (i.e. more money required up front). The Trust offered a significant amount as a loan which would have satisfied HMRC, however, that offer was politely declined and the money found elsewhere.

It's great to see the newish videos the club are releasing - it's especially good to see that the refurbished gym is featuring in them. The Trust made a significant donation towards the refurbishment works and we are expecting some PR on that shortly.

The money involved in both cases comes from Trust Funds (membership, raffles, Quiz/Race Nights, donations, Retro Shirt sales etc etc) and anyone reading this can be rightly proud that the Shrimpers Trust and its members can make such a significant contribution and difference to the club we love.



News from our Ex-Players section **(SUEPA)** - Alan Foggon became our 353rd SUEPA signing and completes our collection of the 77/78 promotion squad. Alan played for us towards the end of a career which saw him achieve a clean sweep of the four North East power houses (including Hartlepool!), win a Fairs Cup and play for Man United plus in the US. He notched up 26 apps for us scoring just once but played his part in our Division Four promotion season including that 4-2 comeback win v Newport which will forever remain in the memories of the 5,840 at Roots Hall that evening.

Our Quid A goal scheme, after a somewhat shaky start, for obvious reason has improved dramatically recently – thanks to the following for their pledges



The Badgers Den offer bespoke Day Opportunities for young people & Adults with learning disabilities, they specialise in Growing independence, teaching life skills, spending time with friends, socialising and accessing the community.

The day was a great success despite the result!

Our project was to restart in February with guests Vibrance. However, due to the postponement of the fixture they were attending, this will be re-arranged (hopefully 19th March). This wonderful group help people with extra needs, to live as normal a life as possible.



However, scheduled for the 26th February, are the **Lancaster Lions** (they are an inclusive football club for athletes with a variety of different needs. They aim to play football in a fun and enjoyable way.)

Coming soon after, will be **Little Heroes** (They are a parent lead support group for families of children who are on the autistic spectrum). They will be our guests for the game vs Dagenham and Redbridge on 12th March.

We try to make the day more than just a football match for our guests, to create a lasting impression. The groups are usually welcomed around midday and given a tour of the stadium, as well as being given the chance to meet the manager and players,

depending on timings. There are photo opportunities throughout, and food and soft drinks are provided, along with the match day tickets, either in the stands, or in executive boxes, depending on the cause.

We hope that by offering easy access and an enjoyable environment, that we will make a real difference to a number of lives.

The aim of the scheme - like most of the Shrimpers Trust's activities is to raise money for Southend United Football Club and in particular Ricky Duncan's Youth Academy helping in the progress of players such as Daniel Bentley, Jack Payne, Nathan Bishop, Elvis Bwomono, Dru Yearwood, Tom Clifford, Lewis Gard, Terrell Egbri, Harry Phillips, Charlie Kelman and Matt Rush.

This is how it works:

Those who support the scheme with a pledge have their name displayed in the United match program.

We ask you to pledge £0.25, £0.50, £1.00 or more under various headings such as clean sheets, various players scoring goals, or team goals. This does not have to cost you a fortune as you can easily judge in advance how much your pledge will cost you come the end of the season.

For example, the Blues rarely manage more than 70 goals in a season from 1st team matches. A £0.25 per goal pledge would therefore most likely not cost you more than £20.00 come the end of the season. If you chose to do £0.50 per point and we finished up with 80 points, at the end of the season we will write to you thanking you for your support of this initiative asking you to send us a cheque for the amount of £40.00.
