The grass is always greener

I write this introduction on Feb 5th , another court case looms and finances at the club are as bad as I've ever known. The infamous "bridge" that Ron Martin has talked about has not materialised, despite assurances it would. Some staff remain unpaid from December, players and staff from January.....and let's not even talk about suppliers.

Could it in fact get any worse...sadly yes. Southend United faces the very real prospect of being wound up on 1st March, unless the magic man can either find some serious money, or manages to convince a judge that he will find it soon.

"Final" as used by the previous judge, sounds pretty frightening of course, but it doesn't really mean anything. HMRC are not going to wind our football club up if there is a reasonable prospect of them getting paid at some point in the future – therein lies the issue!

Of course, because of the myriad of Ron Martin companies, it is tricky to trace the true financial situation of the group, not least because accounts are, or have been, late / very late or probably out of date by the time they are filed. What we do know though from the Gazette, is that Martin Dawn Plc has also come to the attention of HMRC, presumably for the same reasons.

Contrast this mess then, with our nice "shiny" new training pitches - I hope some of you have taken the opportunity to visit. My visit was some weeks back and it really was an interesting 30 mins or so - I never knew piles of sand and mud could be so interesting! Now, of course, the original contractors have finished and the grass is growing nicely.



The well documented problems off the pitch, saw a number of significant financial transactions occur since our last newsletter, between the Football Club on the one hand and the Shrimpers Trust, PG Site and a unified Supporters' Group on the other. This resulted in sizeable amounts of money (in excess of 100K) being made available to Southend United! The generosity of supporters at this difficult time is to be applauded. The campaign attracted national support and I'm sure the powers that be, are extremely grateful to this support, not only from Southend fans, but also from several other clubs – most notably, Wrexham.

The Trust played a part in all three of the transactions above, but most notable of course, was our £40,000 loan. The Shrimpers Trust exists to help the football club and based on information given to us at the time, the Board decided to act - the money was used to pay salaries to staff. This is not a decision the board took lightly and some people have taken exception to this (I was even called to task from a close relative) However, the Trust had the money to help and it would have been an odd decision not to have helped when the club really needed it.

The repayment date (set by the Club) has now passed and obviously we are disappointed with this, however, following certain assurances, we are considering a reasonable extension as we do not wish to further burden, nor complicate matters for Tom Lawrence.

Some months back we reported that we were working with SUFC staff to purchase player rehabilitation equipment. It has taken a while to get this over the line, and we are now in a position to purchase the equipment - at the exact same time as numerous calls to withhold any more funding. If we did this, then we would have gone back on our agreement, and unlike the owner we will not be known for broken promises.

This campaign alerted one of Southend's MP's (Anna Firth), who reached out and confirmed her support and delight at the efforts of fans and sponsors. Anna went on to summarise her support of the club with regards to other "pressing matters".

Trust business has taken over my life recently with work suffering as a consequence.....the situation is not helped by rumours, often inaccurate, and infighting amongst supporters creating a toxic atmosphere. The sad thing is we all want the same thing. By the time we send out our next newsletter, SUFC's predicament should be clearer. In the meantime, check our website and social media channels for the most up to date news.

Only good news from here on down.....

A Cup run...when's the last time we had one of those...ok it's the FA Trophy, but you can only beat what is put in front of you and the burgeoning crowds, suggest it's not just me getting excited.

In the league we continue to perform like a team that deserves to be in the play-offs and if we can get past the 1st March (which I'm sure we will) then let's hope for a great run in!

Of course, good results mean excellent news for our Quid a Goal Scheme, which has really caught the imagination this year, with our sales supremo surpassing all previous records. Thanks to all those who have pledged this year.



Continuing the positive there, our first Social Inclusion guests of the season, "The Badgers Den", were treated to fine performance, on and off the pitch, on their visit during the Scunthorpe game. Thanks to all those that made this visit so special.

Badgers Den offer bespoke day opportunities for young people & adults with learning disabilities, they specialise in growing independence, teaching life skills, spending



time with friends, socialising and accessing the community.

I'd like to re-iterate my thanks to all our sponsors and individuals who have donated to this. If there is any doubt at the difference this project makes, take a look at the Badgers Den Facebook page.

Precious shared old memories relived - and new ones created – at the Solihull Moors game for Chris Barnard on his first return to Roots Hall, since he played for us in 1966. Accompanied by the lovely folk of Down Hall Residential Care Home, it was just such a fabulous day, and is what SUEPA is all about.

Chris was with us as an apprentice back in the 1960's and made his first team debut away at Newport County in the first round of the League Cup. He impressively scored a brace in a 2-2 draw, then notched another in the replay at Roots Hall, as we ran out 3-1 winners. His league debut was shortly afterwards up at Oldham on 17 September 1965 when he came on as sub for Andy Smillie – it was only the second time ever, that we had used a substitute (subs were introduced at the start of the 1965/66 season for injuries only).

Quid-a-Goal

Our Quid a Goal scheme is now up and running for the 2022/23 Season.



The total after the game vs York City played on 4^{th} February is £2,738.50.

This is how it works. Those who support the scheme with a pledge have their name displayed in the United match programme on a regular basis.

We ask you to pledge £0.25, £0.50, £1.00 or more, under various headings such as clean sheets, various players scoring goals, or team goals (you can choose anything reasonable!). This does not have to cost you a fortune, as you can easily judge in advance, how much your pledge will cost you come the end of the season.

For example, the Blues rarely manage more than 70 goals in a season from 1st team matches (21/22 League goals - 45).

A £0.25 per goal pledge would therefore most likely, not cost you more than £15.00, come the end of the season. If funds are tight, how about £1 for every goal scored by our full backs? If you chose to do £0.50 per point and we finished up with 80 points. At the end of the season, we will write to you thanking you for your support of this initiative asking you to send us a cheque for the amount of £40.00.
