


QUIZ NIGHT

SHRIMPERS TRUST POTY AWARDS 2011/12

The Shrimpers Trust held their 2011/12 Player of the Year Awards on 3rd May in the Shrimpers Bar at Roots Hall. Joining the 100 plus Trust members on the night were Paul Sturrock, Graham Coughlan and the Southend United Senior squad. Ricky Duncan and his under 18's Youth team squad also attended, along with Southend United's new CEO Gary Lockett.

The evening included various presentations to members of the first and youth teams, culminating in the Trust's 2011/12 Goal of the Season and Player of the Year awards.

The Trust's Vice Chairman, Paul Yeomanson who was host for the evening opened by extending a warm welcome to everyone and in particular thanked Paul, Graham, Ricky and the players for attending the event.

Youth Team Awards

The Trust's on-going involvement with the Youth structure was highlighted, which included donations made to the Centre of Excellence, as well as shirt sponsorship of the Youth team which had been in place for the last 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ years.

The under 18's had indeed this season finished 6th in the Football League Youth Alliance and had reached the 2nd round of the FA Youth Cup narrowly losing to a strong Brentford side.

Congratulations were extended to goalkeeper Luke Chambers who had secured a 2 year professional contract with the Club, and to Ryan Auger (full-back), Louis Baucutt (centre-half) and Jack Paxman (midfield) who had all been offered 1 year development contracts.

Player of the Month:

As part of the Trust's involvement with the Youth team, Player of the Month awards were made throughout the season, with the winners being chosen by Ricky Duncan and the Trust's Rob Craven.

In recognition of the above, a commemorative framed photo was presented by Ricky to each winner, which were as follows;

Player of the Year:

The winner of this award was presented with the Tom Grace Memorial Shield. The Youth Team Player of the Year award had been renamed in memory of avid Southend United supporter and junior member of the Trust Tom Grace, who sadly had passed away at the age of 15 in 2007. Tom's family had joined the evening, with his father Len making the presentations. Overall winner was Jack Payne with 1st runner up Ryan Auger and 2nd runner up Luke Chambers.

Following all presentations Ricky Duncan spoke briefly of his work as Head of Youth, with his key objective being to produce as many players as possible who then would make the transition into the first team. Ricky finished by saying how appreciative he was of the Trust's on-going support to the Youth team and how he very much valued their involvement as a key sponsor.





Junior Shrimpers Player of the Year:

The SJS Player of the Year as voted for by the Trust's under 16 members, was presented to Southend defender Mark Phillips by Junior Shrimper Luke Edmonds.

Top Traveller Awards:

For the 2011/12 season the Trust had again run coaches to all away league and cup fixtures, having so far clocked up some 8,768 miles. There were three supporters, Shane Chapman, Lesley Hicks and Gaye Overall

who had travelled with the Trust to all these games. With the possibility remaining that Southend would be involved in the play offs, there would of course potentially be more miles to be added to the tally. It was therefore confirmed that the Top Traveller Awards would be made at a later date. Current Top Junior Traveller Luke Chittocks (7,554 miles) would also receive his award at the same time.

Finally on behalf of the Trust Committee and those was had travelled with the Trust this term, Paul Yeomanson thanked Clare Brooks for all the work she had once again undertaken this season organising and running Away travel.



Goal of the Season:

The Martin Cramner Goal of the Season award, named in memory of lifelong Southend United supporter Martin who had passed away at the start of the 2010/11 season aged 40, was presented by his wife Zoe Cranmer. The contenders for this award as voted by Trust members, were Bilel Mohsni v Northampton at home, Ryan Hall v Cheltenham at home and Anthony Grant v Wimbledon at home. Defender/utility man Bilel Mohsni's first goal in the Northampton match, a screamer from 35 yards, was adjudged to be a very popular winner.

Player of the Season:

Paul Sturrock presented the main award of the evening. 2nd runner up was Ryan Hall, 1st runner up Mark Phillips, with Trust members voting defender Sean Clohessy as their overall winner. In accepting his award, Sean who had made near on 50 league and cup appearances for the Blues so far this season, thanked both Paul Sturrock and Graham Coughlan for the ongoing support and guidance they had given to him during his time to date with the Club. He also paid tribute to his team mates who he said had performed very well this season.

Paul Sturrock on behalf of his management team and the players thanked the Trust for their support and financial backing over the last season, which he said was greatly appreciated. He added that he was keen for this relationship to continue.





Turning his thoughts to the weekend match against Macclesfield Town and the possibility if other results went our way that Southend could secure automatic promotion, he said that he was insisting that his players focus on the job in hand and that they didn't worry about other results. He urged that supporters should give full and vocal support to the team on Saturday and not be too dispirited should we not make it at the weekend. He stressed that the important thing was to secure three points on Saturday and then we would have kept the winning momentum going into any play off situation.

Paul finished off by taking a few questions from the floor, including enlightening the audience regarding his lucky cream jacket which he vowed to keep wearing to matches until we lost. Paul however made it clear that combining his kilt with the jacket for the last game of the season would not an option for him!

He described the 2011/12 season as a roller-coaster of ups and downs which had included some excellent performances from the team, particularly away from home, but that there had also been some poor performances at home. Whilst we had suffered in terms of selection options due to injuries and suspensions, he paid credit to his squad of players who he said had all worked very hard throughout the season. All he said had been fantastic.

In response to a question asking for more detail regarding any proposed pre-season tour for next season, Paul confirmed that no firm decision had been made on location as yet. Whilst giving somewhat cryptic clues regarding potential locations, he would not be further drawn. Also he said that no decisions had been made as yet regarding players who might be retained or released by the Club. This he said would be very much driven by budget, but would not be considered until the 2011/12 season was brought to a conclusion.

Having read out a short message from the Trust Chairman Paul FitzGerald who unfortunately due to business commitments had not been able to attend the evening, Paul Yeomanson wrapped the evening up by thanking Paul, Graham, Ricky, the support teams and all the players for taking the time to attend the evening.

Final thanks were also given to Trust members who had attended and for all the support they had given to the Trust over the season.

It was noted that the auction of the 2011/12 home shirt signed by the first team raised £130. The raffle which had been held on the night raised a further £140.

Freddy Eastwood scored one and set up another as Southend relit their hopes of automatic promotion with a 2-0 victory over AFC Wimbledon at a wet Roots Hall stadium. Eastwood put the Blues in front and it was a pass from the Southend legend that led to Anthony Grant's stunning 90th minute strike.

The recalled David Martin looked dangerous early on as his runs down the left gave cause for excitement but very little end product was evident. Ryan Hall then caused Seb Brown to get down low to save well from his long-range effort after good quick play from Bilel Mohsni.

Moncur made Belford move quickly to save his effort and a once rumoured Blues target, Harrison, saw his good strike go wide of the target as the match was pretty uneventful. Freddy Eastwood then came to life for the first time in the game as he linked up well with Martin but the former Millwall man couldn't hit the target when well placed.

Michael Timlin, back in the centre of the park, was pulling the strings in the midfield and the former Swindon man had an attempt on goal but it didn't test Brown. The first half petered out with very little action to report.

The first action in the second half came from the visitors. West Ham loanee Moncur played the ball into Prior and the striker turned and struck an effort on goal but his strike curled wide of the goal.

Southend then kick started their promotion push when club hero Freddy Eastwood put them in front. A corner was headed back across goal by Phillips and the on loan Coventry City forward flicked a header past Brown to send the home fans wild.

Anthony Grant then secured all three points when he struck home a stunning strike in the 90th minute. He collected a pass from Eastwood before taking a touch then striking home into the far corner from 25 yards.

Southend United's automatic promotion hopes are all-but over despite dominating large periods of the game against The Gulls. With six points the difference between the top three, and us the last chance looks like Barnet at home this Friday, if Southend are going to claim an automatic place.

Freddy Eastwood dropped to the bench as he continued to carry a knee problem and it was his replacement, Harris, that had the first chance of the game but his 25 yard effort was straight at the goalkeeper in the Torquay net.

Cameron Belford was equal to anything that came his way in the Blues goal as Southend looked to get the opening goal of the game. They were playing well to be fair and were only denied by the crossbar as Ryan Hall thundered a free-kick towards their goal.

Former Norwich man Jarvis was causing most of the danger to Southend, his shot went over, before Chris Barker was on hand to clear the ball after his cross was creating cause for concern in the Blues box. At the start of the second half it was Jarvis causing problems again and former Blues trialist Howe, having an attempt on goal, joined him but both efforts didn't cause any problems.

Michael Timlin then sent a fizzing effort inches wide of the goal before the midfielder played a stunning through ball to Mohsni, but the goalkeeper was equal to his clever effort and keep the scores level.

There were a couple of shouts for a penalty for Southend. The first looking like a blatant handball and then Phillips was clearly shoved in the back, but the referee failed to give a penalty.

Substitute Freddy Eastwood was inches away from securing a win for Southend but he failed to connect with a superb Ryan Hall cross.

Bilel Mohsni netted a hat-trick as Southend United confirmed their participation in the play-offs at least this season. The versatile player netted all his three goals in the opening half as Blues cruised to victory and after the weekend's results, still in with a chance of an automatic promotion place.

Southend knew that three points tonight would cement a play-off place at least and they took the lead with the first chance of the game. Neil Harris curled a free-kick from 20 yards that beat the goalkeeper but smashed onto the post, and the ball fell to Bilel Mohsni, who got the ball over the line to give Southend the lead.

Neil Harris was enjoying, which many believe, was his best performance in a Southend shirt and after the former Millwall man nearly set up Bilel for his second, the striker then saw a dipping shot from 30 yards well saved by former Luton keeper Brill in the Bess net.

Mohsni and Harris were working together extremely well and were causing The Bees a lot of trouble, before Mohsni did finally net his second, a header from a corner. The Frenchman powerfully headed home a Ryan Hall corner to take his goal tally up to 11 goals for the season and put Southend United in the driving seat.

Just seven minutes after scoring the second Mohsni scored his third goal of the evening. Another Hall corner was headed by Mohsni, the power on the header was enough to find the back of the net, beating the efforts of the Barnet player on the line trying to save the goal.

Neil Harris came mightily close to scoring the goal he fully deserved but his header looped over the crossbar, before Mohsni tried his luck from 50 yards, seeing Brill off his line, but the goalkeeper got back in time to prevent a stunning goal.

Freddy Eastwood did brilliantly to create an effort for himself but his shot was off target, substitute David Martin made Brill push his effort away, but it didn't really trouble the keeper.

Goals from Ryan Hall and Bilel Mohsni fired Southend to within one point of automatic promotion as The Blues were victorious by 2 goals to nil at Oxford United. A stunning free-kick and a guided header proved to be enough for The Shrimpers who were by far the better team throughout the 90 minutes of the match.
