## THE INTRODUCTION - Paul FitzGerald

The Trust held its AGM followed by a Q & A with Steve Kavanagh on the 4th February – the formal matters are rarely very exciting and this year was no different. Thanks to those who attended and for helping to make the evening worthwhile.

A formal report will appear in our next newsletter but I thought it worth mentioning a few highlights. Sir Teddy Taylor as our honorary president was in attendance and as usual offered to stand down citing age – but as usual, we were having none of that and are delighted that Sir Teddy remains. Several of our own volunteers have had a rethink on the time they can give to the Trust and have stood down, several citing that they felt guilt at not turning up for committee meetings. Attendance at meetings is not mandatory, but of course we do occasionally need a quorum to make decisions. To this end we have introduced a new category to ensure that committee members can be involved if they want to, without the need to be present on a cold Monday in January in some dismal bar – not that the Shrimpers (our current location) is dismal in any way!

On a more positive note I am delighted to welcome John Austin as a new committee member – I understand Paul Yeomanson has great plans for John – more of that later.



An important football club item mentioned at the Q & A part of the AGM, was the rebirth of the Blues Lottery. Steve Kavanagh had previously called a meeting that included Trust representatives with a view to reviewing and replacing the current Lottery process. It had largely been left untouched and unloved for many months. Steve explained how Charlton ran their lottery (very successfully) and explained his hopes for the future with money ring-fenced solely for the Youth setup. The plans/ideas are not really too dissimilar to the original plans, but one key difference is worth noting. The committee previously consisted of a majority of Football Club Directors, this time they will be in the minority (two of five) with an independent chairman and two Trust members (Bryan Woodford and Rob Craven)

At a recent Fans Forum meeting, some thought was given to the current representation and as such an individual (John Walton) from a supporters group (The Exiles) has been invited to join the fans forum. The Exiles are currently a relatively small group of fans who live outside of the borough of Southend (often far away!). It's clear that these fans have a different set of needs. Consequently, this group are formalising and would be interested in anyone who would like to join. You can contact me for further information as I am just about a member of this group (following my exile to South Woodham, several years ago). It is likely that the Fans Forum will expand further – specifically we are keen to have a representative for the younger supporters and someone from the fairer sex.

In the last Newsletter I made an appeal for funds, specifically to buy equipment for player match analysis. We are delighted with the response so far with nearly half the target raised. So.....for anyone out there who meant to participate but hasn't got around to it yet – I'd like to appeal one more time. We still need around 500 Pds if we are not to compromise our previous commitment to maintain our financial reserves this year. As a reminder:

"The equipment required costs £1000 and what we'd like is to find a number of people prepared to donate £10 to this cause. For each £10 raised, that person (or family) will have their name displayed in the program; will have a chance to visit the training ground to see the training and be shown the type of analysis performed; have the opportunity to travel with the team to an away game + have the opportunity to sit in the directors box for a home game. The First team are to play their part and are all looking at donating items that we can auction. Steve himself is to speak to several contacts with a similar idea in mind."

The early donators will be going into a draw soon – so if you or anyone in your family would like to get involved please do. The odds of getting to do something here are somewhat better than the lottery and it would be fair to say that "everyone's a winner"

#### **Quid-a-Goal**

Our Quid A Goal scheme is now up and running for the 2012/13 Season.

#### The total raised so far after 45 Games is £1,129.00

The aim of the scheme - like most of the Shrimpers Trust's activities is to raise money for Southend United Football Club and make sure that there is a club for us to be supporting in the foreseeable future. In particular, some of the money raised from this Seasons "Quid a Goal" scheme will be donated to the Southend United Centre of Excellence, in particular to the Under 18's as part of our on-going support for SUFC's Youth Team.



#### This is how it works:

Those who support the scheme with a pledge have their name and details of their pledge displayed in the United match program each week and are detailed on this web site.

We ask you to pledge £0.25, £0.50, £1.00 or more under various headings such as clean sheets, various players scoring goals, or team goals. This does not have to cost you a fortune as you can easily judge in advance how much your pledge will cost you come the end of the season.

For example, the Blues rarely manage more than 80 goals in a season from 1st team matches. A £0.25 per goal pledge would therefore most likely not cost you more than £20.00 come the end of the season. If funds are tight how about £1 for every goal scored by our full backs? The 08/09 season would have cost you £3.00. If you chose to do £0.50 per point and we finished up with 80 points. At the end of the season we will write to you thanking you for your support of this initiative and asking you to send us a cheque for the amount of £40.00.

Last year this scheme raised more than £2,000 from the 60+ people that helped us. This includes support by some of the Southend United's directors.

## **BARBER'S BLURB - TERRACE TALK MONTHLY ROUND-UP**

Hello everybody and welcome to 2013!

I hope you all had a happy 2012 and a very enjoyable festive period, and I would like to wish you all the success in the new year, happiness is always the key to enjoying life.

I report on the first weekend of December when Southend travelled away to Bury in the FA Cup. A cup tie against a league one side could be tricky but Southend left Gigg Lane with a replay. They fell behind to a Doherty penalty but Gavin Tomlin scored a wonderful solo goal to level the scores. We all thought we had won the game but Timlin and Corr both hit the post in the dying minutes, so the two teams would have to replay at Roots Hall.

Southend did win the replay with Tomlin once scoring for the home side after they fell behind, but it was Daniel Bentley's night as he saved two spot kicks to ensure Blues' passage to the next round where they would face Brentford at home.

Next up after Bury was a home game against Brentford but this was in the JPT. We have had a good history in this competition but if we get past the Bees the chance of winning the cup would look increasingly possible. We went ahead in the 27th minute through a deflected effort from Tamika, scoring his first goal for Southend.

Just before the break Kevan Hurst scored the goal of the round when he picked the ball up from the right before unleashing a dipping drive that was hit with his laces into the far corner of the net to put us in a commanding position. Paul Hayes scored a consolation for the visitors as Southend held out to get into the next round of the competition.

A long trip to Fleetwood soon followed and it proved to be a disappointing but pleasing result. We drew a blank with the hosts but Blues feel they should have gained all three points as Anthony Straker and Marc Laird saw goals ruled out for some reason before a stone wall penalty was not awarded by the officials. The home side did improve in the second half but they didn't ever really threaten Blues' goal and a point was the least we deserved.

The games came thick and fast for The Shrimpers and the next match was home to Arsenal conquering Bradford City. It proved to be a tough game but when the visitors raced into a two goal lead it wasn't really deserved, however, the spirit and steel of this Southend side was event as two goals in the final ten minutes clinched a draw. The goals were scored from Cresswell and Tomlin.

On the day that was dubbed the end of the world, Gavin Tomlin and co, showed it wasn't the end of our good form as a second half master class put Chesterfield to the sword. Ryan Cresswell scored a stunning volley, albeit with a help of a deflection, before Gavin Tomlin scored a stunning header from a fantastic Hurst cross. The striker was at it again ten minutes later when he nodded home to end a flowing move that involved every single player in the side. Fantastic goal.

Boxing Day soon came and it was another three goals scored by Blues as they demolished their local rivals with another Tomlin inspired performance. The former Daggers striker opened the scoring with a deflected shot inside th first minute before Assombalonga and Laird paired up to set up the striker for goal number 14 of the campaign. The in-form forward then teed up Hurst for his thunderbolt to put the game beyond Dagenham and extend the unbeaten run to 14 games.

The final game of the year saw us visit Burton Albion and it proved to be the final game of our unbeaten run as the hosts won by two goals to nil. Former Southend target Calvin Zola opened the scoring with a scrappy and untidy close range finish after a mix up in the defence. Another dodgy goal by the Albion this time with Bell seeing his shot, that was heading for the corner flag, hit Barker and fly into the back of the net.

Southend didn't get going at all in the second half and it proved to be a very flat end of the year, after what was a fantastic month.

January is the start of a new year and Southend didn't make the best of starts to life in 2013, by going down by a goal to nil at home to Gillingham. After the defeat to Burton it was important to get off to a good start and it didn't happen. It was midfielder Chris Whelpdale that scored the early goal which was enough for the visitors to see out a win even though we did play a lot better in the second half it wasn't enough.

The next game was FA Cup football and that always is a big day in the footballing calendar. We hosted League One Brentford which would be no easy test but we always seem to raise our game against better opposition. The task was made even harder as we fell two goals behind but two goals from Barry Corr fired us to a replay at Griffin Park, however, we could have won the game but Tomlin saw his powerful header tipped over the bar and to safety.

Daniel Bentley and Elliot Benyon were the penalty kick heroes for Blues at Oxford in the JPT semi-final as we were victorious by 5-3 in the shoot out. Barry Corr scored a deserved early goal to put us in front before the hosts lead on the night 2-1. Barry scored his second and was joined on the scoresheet by Clohessy as we looked set to go through to the area final, but Oxford equalised in the dying moments as Paul Smith was replaced by Bentley and the young shot stopper saved the day to book a two legged tie with Orient.

A long trip to Exeter followed after our cup exploits and it looked like the side didn't turn up as we were comfortably beaten by three goals to nil at St. James' Park. Former Barnet striker John O'Flynn netted twice and he was joined on the scoresheet by Bennett as Southend's slump in the league continued.

The replay against Brentford was next up and the winners knew they would be hosting Premier League Chelsea in the next round. In all honesty the best team won as the hosts battered Southend and it was only the fine form of Paul Smith that kept the score down. He made save after save and then produced a stunning to stop to tip a penalty over the crossbar. Barry Corr had nodded Southend level but an earlier Hayes effort and a late deflected shot from Donaldson won the tie for Brentford.

Paul Smith continued his fine form as Southend secured a win in the league thanks to a smash and grab victory at Chesterfield. The goalkeeper produced two stunning saves from Richards in the first half and also produced a fantastic save in the last few minutes to secure a victory for Southend after Gavin Tomlin curled home a wonderful striker in the 83rd minute to keep us in the play-off places.
