A MATCH FOR JAMES – WHAT A BEAUTIFUL DAY



Sunday 28 May was such a beautiful day.

We publicised our 'Match for James' campaign in our last Newsletter and the build up to it was frantic. Our small organising team certainly learned a great deal about how to put on a football match – it is not straightforward, but in the end, all went to plan, including our order for great weather.

Just to give you a little flavour of the 'to-do' list, it included the venue (and the good folk of Bowers & Pitsea were just great), liaising with Tilly re team arrangements, physio (Ben came complete with his sponge), match day refreshments for players, first aiders, match officials, PA announcer (top man is Ben Fryer!), stewards, turnstile operators, public liability insurance, match trophy (well, we just had to), balls, sponsors (who were all brilliant with their generosity), website page for donations and online tickets, ticket printing, match programme (drafting, graphics and printing), obtaining auction items, managing auctions, contacting James's old classmates and former co-workers, publicity (lots of social media, a bit of radio and press), raffle arrangements, half-time competition, kit (design and supply), mascots, contacting James's other clubs, tribute video, highlights video of today, our 'We're With You James' promotional push (which included brilliant contributions from Queens Park FC and the SUFC fans on an away coach trip), ball girls, match day entertainment, working with James's therapists phew. All of those that volunteered to help really did play their part in the success of it all.

And then on the day itself the sun shone, players came in from all parts (including Francis Laurent from France, Paul Byrne from Ireland, and many others from distances long and short across the UK), and an estimated crowd of 500-plus (including members of Harry Kane's family who are close friends of James's family) came in support and to witness the SUFC Legends run out 8-2 winners (including a Barney hatrick!).

Moment of the day? Well, there were many – James's old school friend and fellow footballer/cardiac arrest sufferer Fabrice Muamba coming along to lend his support (and give a team talk to the Farke Knights opposition were such great sports on the day), Damian Scannell and his team of 'Super Dads' arriving during the second half to a standing ovation after completing a gruelling 50-mile run to get there

But above all else it was the joy to be seen on James's face. At first on arrival he seemed a bit bewildered by it all, but when he walked on to the pitch with his mum Dawn and his carer, flanked by both teams, to receive the applause from all, his face as he realised it was all for him was just priceless. And from then-on he just didn't stop smiling, from kicking the game off, to greeting friends, family and fans, and to receiving the trophy at the end that now sits proudly on a shelf at his home his day was truly fantastic.



Of course, the aim of it all was to raise money to help fund the additional care that James so badly needs, and the final total (we still have a couple of items left to auction at some point) was more than £20,000 which certainly exceeded our expectations. So, a huge thank-you to all who supported this, and you will be pleased to know that the monies are already being put to good use. James is now going to three therapy activity-days a week instead of two, plus is now receiving regular speech therapy sessions. James's mum Dawn, with who we continue to be in regular contact with (and who was with us at Roots Hall for the season opener last Saturday), has said that she has noticed a good improvement in James's social and general capability skills in the last couple of months and puts this down to the extra help now being given that otherwise could not have been afforded. That just gladdens the heart even more.

We will continue to keep you informed of James's progress and hope to get him back to Roots Hall at some point as one of our match day guests. That will be emotional.

Since our last Newsletter we've added 13 new members to the SUEPA family.

Between the sticks



Two new shot-stoppers to report to bring our total available for selection to 47. Anyone tried to see how many keepers you can fit along the goal line?

First up is Patrik Gunnarsson who played three games with us on loan from Brentford until the covid shutdown in March 2019 when he was in the team that won 3-1 v Bristol Rovers, and there his Shrimper journey ended. The 22-year-old Icelandic international is now playing for Viking FC in Norway – former Shrimpers are spread far and wide across the globe.

"Here we go-o, SUEPA Steve Arnold in goal!" (you'll need to have been at Roots Hall over the last two seasons to be familiar with that little terrace ditty – just apply a familiar Status Quo rift to get the feel for it). Arnie made 53 appearances in two seasons, was our 2021/22 Player of the Season, is an all-round great guy who always made himself available to speak to the fans, and we didn't want him to go but we all know why he had to, and we wish him all the very best for the season ahead at Sutton.

At the back

During Leon Constantine's visit in April (see later) we also caught up with Gary Banks. Son of Mr Southend United himself (Frank in case you didn't know!), Gary was with us as a youth 1983-86 and as a reserve player 1986-89.

Gary told us:

"We competed in the old South-Eastern Counties division for the youths playing teams like Arsenal, Spurs, Crystal Palace, QPR, Norwich City, Aston Villa, Southampton, etc.... playing against some incredible players and I scored against Arsenal beating Tony Adams in the process."

Then I went on to play several seasons for the reserves winning the reserve league trophy where we remained unbeaten that season and paraded the trophy in front of a sell-out Roots Hall stadium on the last game of the season. We also won the cup that season too and I think I was the only player to play every game during it which I believe is still the most successful campaign the reserves have ever had. This was the era Paul Clark was the manager of the club.

Another special memory was that I played alongside greats like, Justin Edinburgh, John Keely, Eric Steele, Paul Clark and Danny O'Shea that season so we had a very good team and I felt extremely privileged to have played in such a golden era at the club."

Gary went on to enjoy success with Great Woking and Billericay. It is lovely to have another father and son team on board in the SUEPA ranks (we'll leave you guessing as to the other!), and by the look of his baby grandson intently focusing on the match in progress we may well have another member of the Banks clan being a Shrimper player one day.

Now for two much more recent ex-Shrimpers. We'll all miss our top former centre back Shaun Hobson who clocked up 129 appearances (six goals including his 'Messi' last season!) in a Shrimpers shirt and wish Hobbo all the very best in his new venture as a Latic. Similarly, Tom Clifford is now signed up to SUEPA. With 62 appearances for us (five goals), Tom became our 460th member (in a now 130-strong SUEPA defensive line-up) and now has a season ahead of him at Kings Lynn in the National League North. Tom also now has the distinction of being our quickest ever signing – we secured him for SUEPA just 55 minutes after his Roots Hall departure was officially announced (beating the previous three-hour record for Simon Cox)!

Middle of the park



Billy Kellock signed up for us back in March after we got in contact with one of his friends who was running an appeal to help Billy. With us in the 1983/84 season scoring nine from 45 appearances, the former Posh, Wolves, Kettering, etc midfielder has not enjoyed the best of health in recent times and we wish you all the best Billy on your road to recovery.

Sam Barratt became SUEPA's landmark 450th member. Signed in the Summer of 2018, he made one appearance before suffering a bad injury, coming back to make nine more before leaving in August 2020 to go back to Maidenhead, and after three seasons of regular football at York Road he has just signed for Barnet for the 2023/24 campaign.

Of all the former Shrimpers taking part in our Match for James there was one who until then had eluded our attempts to get in touch but in the end it proved an easy signing to make as in the changing room pre-match Kevin Betsy was delighted to sign up. With us 2008-10 making 43 apps (three goals) he made over 600 career apps scoring 100+ times and is now at Cambridge United as Assistant Manager.

We have finally caught up with James Dunne (via LinkedIn). James scored twice for us in 26 apps in the 2021/22 season, and the former Arsenal, Pompey, and Exeter man is now at Welling United.

Jacob Mellis, who played for us three times in the 2021/22 season, has now joined our ranks. Jacob's recent homeless plight was highlighted in a Daily Mail article but he is now seeking help from Sporting Chance and has set himself up as freelance scout - good luck Jacob, we are all rooting for you!

Jon Benton is another of our 'recent SUFC leaver/recent SUEPA joiner' recruits who has opted to now join Aveley FC where he had great success on loan last season. With us since the age of eight and making six first team appearances, we are sure he is going to have a great future - good luck Jon!

Rob Howard is our final midfield joiner to announce. With us as a youngster before joining Arsenal at age 14, he then re-signed at Roots in 2018 and made five appearances before leaving for Welling, and he is now at Bishops Stortford. 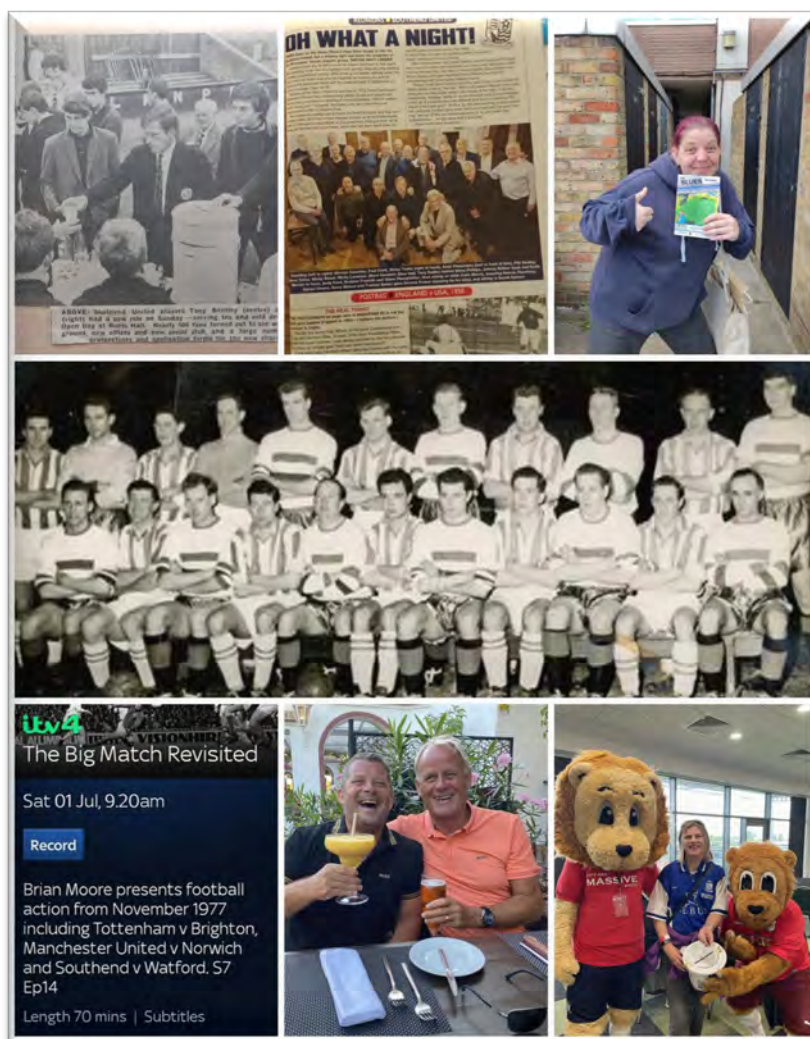
NEWS BITS

Eddie was born on 7 August 1933 and is our oldest SUEPA member. Now residing in the USA, Eddie came across from his native South Africa to join Charlton in 1950. 'The Golden Turkey' as he was known during his time in Italy (he won three Italian caps – his grandfather was Italian) eventually landed at Roots Hall in 1965 (how on earth we managed to attract a player of his calibre is anyone's guess) and plundered 28 goals in 62 appearances before ending his UK playing career back at The Valley.
