


SUFC V BOREHAM WOOD (4-2)



GUESTS: LITTLE HEROES



On 6th January vs Halifax we gave a very warm welcome to Little Heroes.

Little Heroes is a small charity support group for parents and family of children with a diagnosis, or potential diagnosis of ASD. They provide activity sessions for the families supported during school holidays and at festive periods. The group was originally set up by Helen Smith-Vicary, ASD Specialist Portage Home Visitor and Kim Drake, whose son Alfie was diagnosed with autism back in 2011 when he was just 3 years old.

Little Heroes ASD Support Group began as a coffee morning at a local children's centre early October 2012. You do not require an official diagnosis to attend their sessions. They offer a safe place for parents and carers to chat with other like minded people, in a non-judgemental environment.

Other regular sessions include Dad's Club, Girl's Club, Youth Club, Home Ed Sessions, After School Club and Evening Parent/Carer Creative sessions.

Feedback from the Group leader confirmed our hopes for the day!

SUFC V BROMLEY (1-2)

GUESTS: RAYLEIGH REBELS FOOTBALL CLUB



On 16th December vs Bromley (1-2) we welcomed guests from **Rayleigh Rebels Football Club**. Rayleigh Rebels is an all-inclusive community club for those with and without special educational needs (SENDs) and additional needs.

The club was set up in 2018 as a youth project to provide free football sessions for boys and girls. It was decided that sessions would be free so that every child had the opportunity to play football whilst also feeling a part of a team without judgement. As the team grew, they were approached by parents who found there was a lack of teams able to cater for those with SENDs and additional needs.

Those parents felt mainstream teams lacked the knowledge and understanding of SENDs and additional needs. The club caters for boys and girls between the ages of 6 and 16-years-old and currently has three teams: two in Rayleigh and one in Great Wakering. We have since been in regular contact with James and are pleased to learn that he has been making steady progress. The Walkers had a fantastic day with us. A real bonus was meeting up with James's long-time pal Myles Weston, who had just signed for Bromley. We couldn't quite persuade James to venture too far on to the pitch before kick-off, but he got a great reception from the Roots Hall faithful, and he and his family all had a top day.
